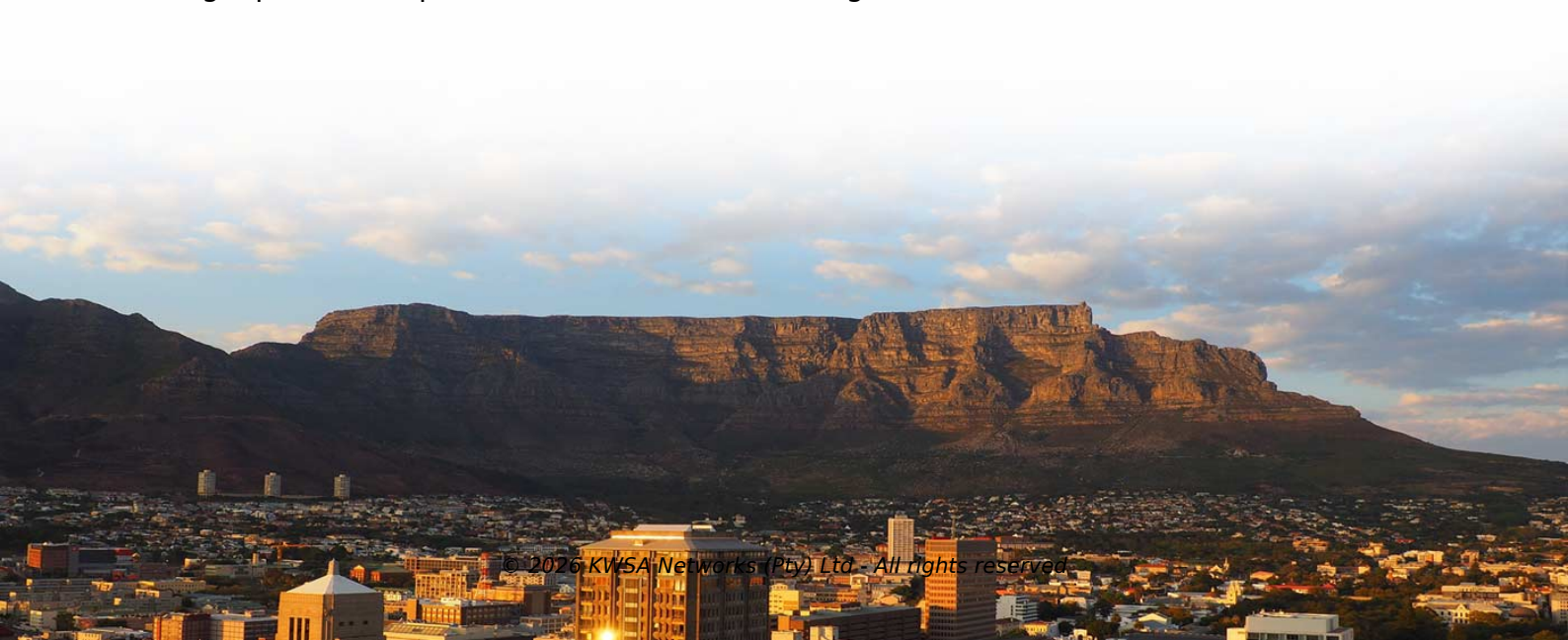


Unable to find electrical distribution box in France



Overview

If your property does not currently have an electricity supply you will need to make application for such a supply to EDF (Edenis). The request for a supply is called a demande de raccordement, which can be made by letter or on-line at Demande de prestation liée au raccordement. Getting electricity in a new home in France requires three steps: an Enedis network connection (2-6 months, typically €400-€1,685 TTC), a CONSUEL compliance certificate (~€145 TTC), and an electricity supplier contract. Once the line is in place, activating supply with a Linky meter costs €1. The electricity supply authority EDF (Electricite de France) will provide a meter, fuses and a main current operated circuit breaker. In both cases 2 & 3 you need to approach ENEDIS to get a price to create a new permanent electrical supply ("branchement définitif") for the property. Whatever your immediate approach to get power is I strongly advise that you get this sorted sooner rather than later as you will then know what you.
